should be changed as the state government had not made any considerable change in the fee structure in the past several years.

"In 2003, the fee was slashed by 15 per cent and in 2007 the roll back was reinstated. This year the managements want a complete overhaul of the fee structure," said a management representative.

"The managements put forth the argument that they want an increase in the fee structure as it is difficult to run colleges with a fee structure that was in place seven years ago. The colleges conveyed to AFRC that they will expect a considerable increase in the B and C category fees," said an official from APSCHE.

The officials, however, said that the final decision on the matter will be taken by the AFRC in the coming week.
